

Saving YouTube for Playback

When losing access to the Internet during class, teachers lose access to that 2-minute YouTube.

Need a solution? Here is how:

1. (My preference) Since you may have many videos that you storehouse, purchase a flash drive. Most already have one. That way, you store all the content on the drive and transport from home to work and vice versa. You may even want to create a folder for the videos.
2. Go to YouTube and select the particular video.
3. Right-click COPY the URL (web address).
4. Go to <http://savetube.com/>
5. Paste it in the area beside VID>.

Paste a Video URL and let the Java Applet start. The download links will then display.

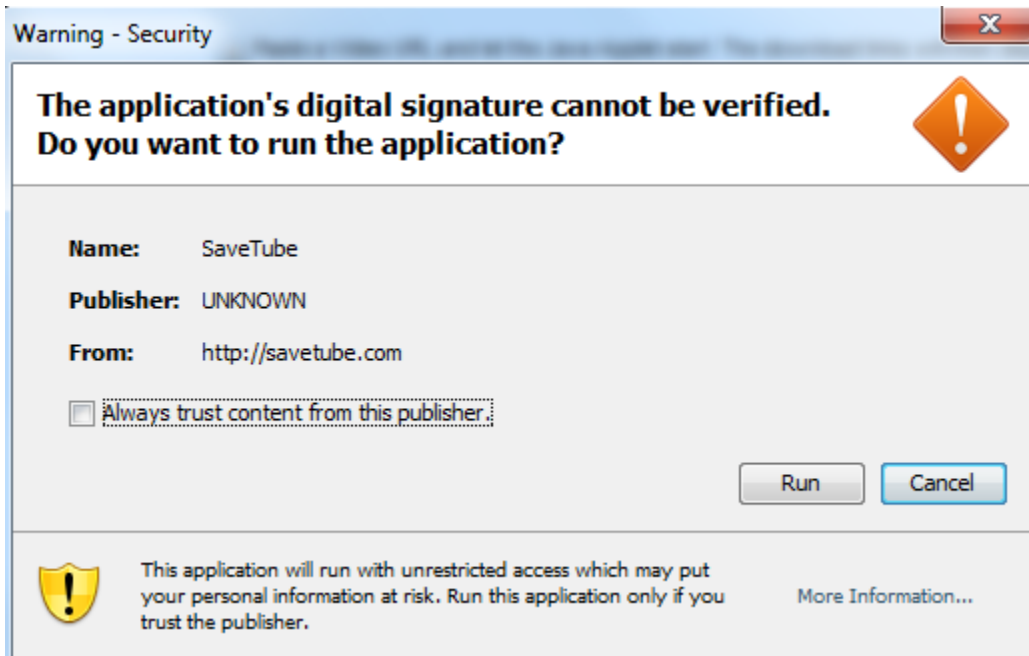

6. Now, click VID. Notice, you can select MP3 and Ringtone as well.


7. This should pop up.



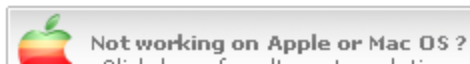
8. So, click RUN.
9. After step #8, you should see the following (download formats):

- 3GP (Medium Quality - 176x144)
- 3GP (High Quality - 320x240)
- FLV (Low Quality - 400x226)
- FLV (Medium Quality - 640x360)
- FLV (High Quality - 854x480)
- MP4 (High Quality - 480x360)
- MP4 (High Definition - 1280x720)



10. Notice the arrow. I prefer to choose MP4, which should open in Windows Media Player or Quicktime. I choose the 1280 x 720, which is a better quality.
