Coach Brad Bonds

- Brings 127-49-1 overall softball coaching record to AC-S softball.
- Has coached softball teams to 31 or more wins in three of five overall seasons in softball.
- Returns to high school softball after 13 years.
- Served as head coach of the Barren County Trojanettes for two seasons (2002 and 2003). Posted a 30-25 record with the Trojanettes.
- Succeeded Rick Roberts as AC-S coach in 2004.
- Guided 2005 Lady Patriot softball to Region 4 championship.
- Led AC-S to a fifth (tie) place in 2005 KHSAA state tournament.
- 2005 team finished with 34 wins---then tied for second most wins in season by Lady Patriot team.
- Led 2006 Lady Patriots to 31-8-1 record, Region 4 Runner-up.
- Coached Class 2A Player-of-the-Year Jamie Ogles.
- Guided 2007 Lady Patriots to 32-6 worksheet, Region 4 Runner-up.
- 2007 coaching staff selected as Class 2A Staff-of-the-Year.
- Stepped aside in 2007 with AC-S softball coaching record of 97-24-1
- Coached five All-State softball players including two (Jamie Ogles and Emma Napier) future AC-SH Hall of Fame inductees.
- Coached college softball signees/players Amber Shrum, Jamie Ogles, Emma Napier, Tasha Witcher, Tisha Witcher, and Patrika Barlow.
- Three year softball resume includes leading teams to one Region title, two runner-ups, three District titles and a 41-4 record in Region 4 play.
- Named AC-S Lady Patriot basketball coach in summer of 2007.
- 11 seasons as head coach of the Lady Patriots.
- Overall girls basketball coaching record of 222-113.
- Selected as Region 4 Coach of the Year in 2013, 2014, and 2016.
- Guided Lady Patriots to record of 109-19 from 2013-2016.
- Led Lady Patriots to the Houchens Industries/KHSAA State Championship game in 2015---dropped 35-32 title to Holy Cross.
- Guided Lady Patriots to a school-record 30 wins in 2015 (30-5).
- Led AC-S to Region Championship in 2015, Runner-Up in 2013.
- Took AC-S to five Region 4 tournaments in 11 seasons.
- Led ACS to District 15 titles in 2013 and 2015; Runner-up in 2009, 2014, and 2016.
- Led Lady Patriots to an 18-12 record in last season, seventh season his teams have reached 18-win mark.
- Coached NCAA D-I basketball players Shelby Harper, Morgan Rich, and Sarah Sutton and NAIA players Marah Rice, Savannah Gregory, and Sarah Sutton.
- Left Lady Patriot basketball with second highest win total in 44-year history of program (222).
- Coached girls' teams to 21 or more wins five times.
- Named Patriot boys basketball coach in May of 2018.
- Engineered turnaround of Patriot program leading 2019 Patriots to 23-9 record; first appearance in Region 4 tournament since 2013.
- Named as boys Region 4 Coach-of-the-Year in 2019.
- Currently has boys' basketball coaching record of 38-25.
- Slated to coach Patriot basketball in 20-21 season to fulfill commitment of at least three years with Patriot program.
- Refined softball coaching skills in recent summers helping to coach daughter's travel ball team.
- Played/Learned skills under high school coaches David Miller and J.D. Strange and mentor John Butler; Played baseball in high school.
- Overall head coach combined coaching record (all sports) is 387-187-1.
