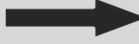


**Using Color to**  **Reveal a response**

This is just an illusion using color. If you drag the text above left or right, some of the text disappears.  
This flipchart shows you how to do it!

Page 1

**First, use the paint bucket to drop color onto your flipchart page.**

Page 2

**Next, click on the shape tool and create a rectangle on 1/2 of your flipchart page. Use the paint bucket to make it a different color from the main part of your page.**

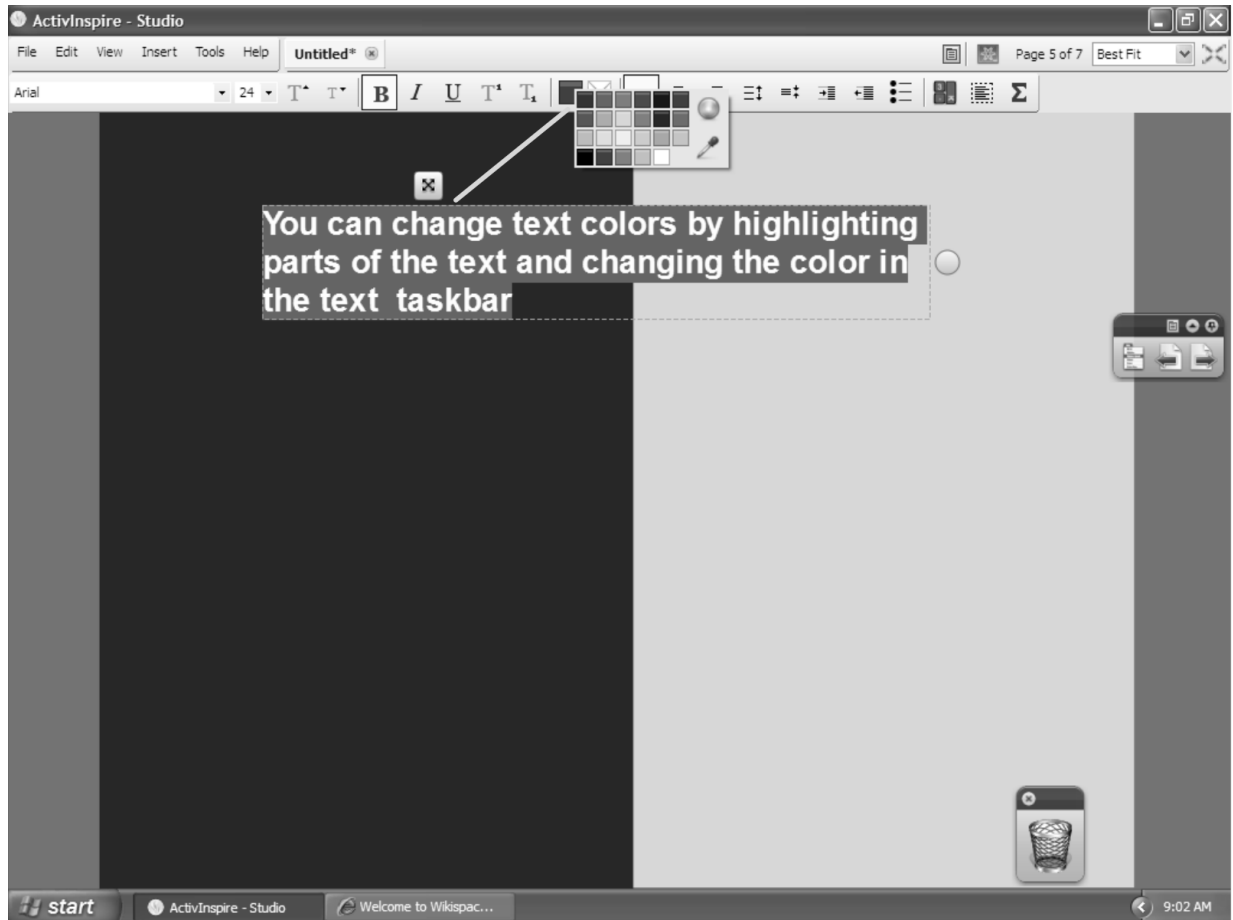
**\*It is a good idea to lock the rectangle in place on the page. To do this, right click on the rectangle and choose LOCKED from the dropdown menu.**

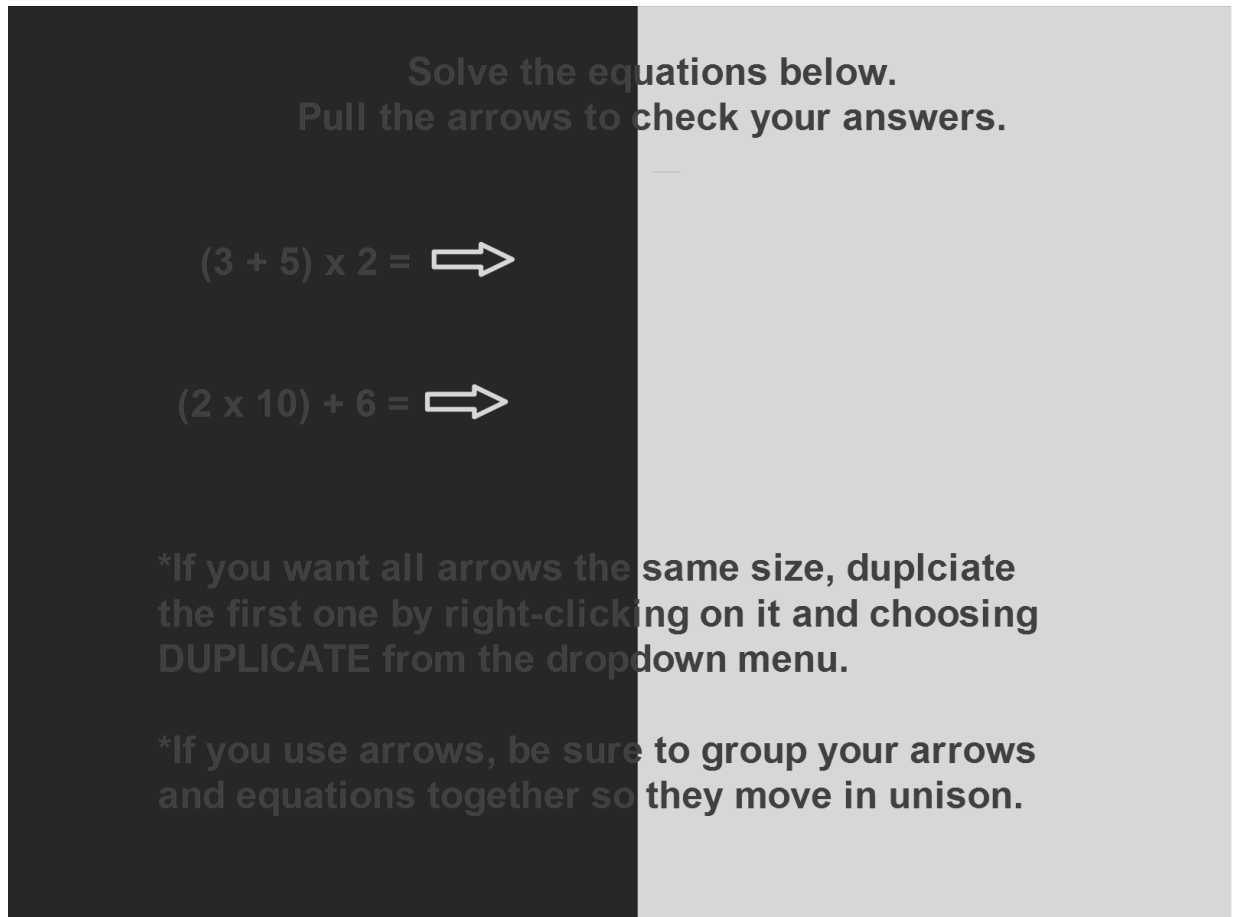
**You will now type the text using two colors. When working on the blue side, I used the same yellow as the main part of my page. When working on the yellow side, I used the same blue as my rectangle.**

**\*This can get tricky so you may want to type all text in black and then highlight certain text and change colors later.**
